Another Justrite - John Coons, 1127 Adams St., Denver, Colorado, 80206, has shown us one more strange aberration of the Justrite series. This one is a brass carbide hand lamp, 3.125 in. (79.375 mm) in diameter x 6.5 in. (165.1 mm) tall, of a generally standard design. What is strange is the heavy steel frame, 4 in. (101.6 mm) x 5 in. (127.0 mm), that is firmly riveted to the upper water reservoir chamber. The burner tip is mounted rather high on the water reservoir. Anyone who knows what possible purpose or use this design has should contact John.

Spence in San Jose, California, has informed us that a complete Snell lamp is in a private collection. The upper water reservoir is very similar to the well-known Ever-Ready carbide cap lamp except that the gas tube exits at about 4 PM from the top of the sphere. The original sketch provided to Bill is reproduced at the right.

"New" News on the Old - Following Wesley Pedlow's find shown on Page 3 of the last Lamp Post, Arthur Gray, Jr., P. O. Box 292,

Cave City, Arkansas, 72521, has sent the sketch at the left. His "new" lamp is black enameled tin, 6-3/4 in. (171.45 mm) tall to the top of the water cap \times 3 in. (76.2 mm) in diameter. What is "new"

news is the 4-1/8 in. (104.78 mm) diameter container A outside the carbide chamber bottom. It must have acted as a water jacket for cooling purposes. It has a set screw B on the outer jacket. A 1-1/2 in. (38.1 mm) long x 1/2 in. (12.7 mm) diameter steel rod C is soldered at the rear of the water chamber top; this has a perpendicular hole drilled through 1/2 in. The bottom of the (12.7 mm) from its end. outer jacket is stamped "PATENT". D is a wing nut screwed into the end of the steel rod,



South America - Mike Puhl, 3648 S. Maplewood,




(95.25 mm) tall x 2 in. (50.8 mm) diameter x 2-3/4 in. (69.85 mm) diameter reflector. Stamping is on bottom as shown. Mike also says that he has seen a Snell lamp. It resembles the Ever-Ready except that the top is somewhat larger, the hook is round instead of flat, the tip comes straight out of the water chamber, and the bottom is soldered at the very bottom of the chamber. Mike also has seen an OKA1 (Fall, 86, Lamp Post) cardboard box from Malaysia with

New Lamp Book - Bill Spence, 2381 Homewood Drive, San Jose, California, 95128, (408)247-4816, has prepared a printed reproduction of the 1905-1906 "Catalogue of the STAR, GLOBE and EAGLE . . . Miner's and Driver's Lamps" as manufactured by George Anton & Bro., Monongahela, Pa. Copies are available postpaid from Bill at his address, \$5.00 each.

Bill also inquires: "Does anyone have any kind of advertising from Ashmead or Stein (i.e., Elkhorn, Buddy, Springfield)?" and "Who has Larry Peterson's current address?"... Bill needs measurements of an early Grier

lamp. Bill's contributions also include the following:

NORLEIGH DIAMOND - Registered to Norvell-Shapleigh Hardware Company of St. Louis. Application was filed January 17, 1910, issued August 2. No first usage designation. Designated class of goods was lanterns, locks and security hardware. The company which later became simply Shapleigh Hardware Company is known to have used the logo on lanterns at least as late as 1916. All of you in the St. Louis area can start beating the bushes now for Norleigh Diamond carbides. Interestingly the registration date is compatible with the known activities of the Maple City Mfg Company, which has been assumed by most collectors to have been the Norleigh's manufacturer.

CROWN - Registered to William Tunnessen of Hazleton, Pa on Sept 8, 1908. The application was filed May 28, 1908 and designated Miner's oil lamps.

IMPERIAL - Registered to Martin Hardsocg Manufacturing Company of Allegheny, Pa. Filed June 6, 1899; first used January 1, 1898; registered July 11, 1899. Class of goods covered was "certain named miners' supplies".

CHIRRY - Registered by Demmler Bros, Pittsburg, Pa on an application filed on February 19, 1889. First usage is 1878, and described class is "miners'

lamps."

McMASTERS - Registered to William P. McMasters of Munhall, Pa for "miners' lamps". Filed on Sept 24, 1894; granted Nov 6, 1894; first used July 1, 1984.

VICTOR - no trademark registration, but in response to Bill's inquiry in the Spring '86 Lamp Post, Chuck Young reported that the Victor name was first reported by Vernon Hatley of Oklahoma who found one in a box with the Victor name and a picture of the lamp--no other info. Vernon, if you're among the Lamp Post's readers, Bill would like to hear from you.

Bill has just received a sketch of a mint SNELL LAMP recently found in Illinois and is happy to report that the sketch looks very much like the EverReady as he theorized in Spring '86. Can anyone shed any light on the now-likely

connection between Arphad Snell and Charles Hoppe?

Bill now has a respectable trading stock of carbides (Elkhorn, Buddy, LuMiNum, Wolf, Pioneer, Justrite Victor and others) and a few miscellaneous other items. 


Justrite Lamp Data - Dave Thorpe, 16646 N. 30th Ave, Phoenix, Arizona, 85023 has prepared the following table as a description of Justrite small-size horizontal carbide cap lamps. While other variations may exist, this table is intended to show where general design changes occurred in relation to each other. Since the bases found on lamps today are not necessarily those with which the lamp was originally manufactured, the 'base' data is included only as a rough indication of where the change in bottom design may have occurred. A horizontal line marks the location of a new change in design of a particular category.



Combination - Dave Thorpe has sent the following three items: • How to determine if your Gem cap lamp reflector is original All Gem cap lamp reflectors have a peculiar mark inside the reflector just eccentric to where the burner tube emerges. It appears as a tiny 1/16 in. (1.59 mm) circle stamped in the metal. In fact, if one looks at the Gee Bee reflector, it becomes apparent that this was, at one time, an indentation designed to hold the reflector firmly against the reflector brace. When the Gem was manufactured, this indentation was hammered back flush, leaving just the appearance of a tiny circle. Same dies, different manufacturer?

Certain cap lamps have water tanks of identical dimensions, but were sold by different manufacturers. The most obvious example is the early style AutoLite and the Springfield. Another is the late style AutoLite tank which is identical in dimension to the Elkhorn, and the early style Simmons Pioneer

(the type without a reflector brace).








Moonbeams - Tony Moon, 214 Via Mantilla, Walnut

a mule lamp. It is very difficult to get anything
from the small oil wick lamp screw tops.
